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Initial Evaluation, Diagnosis, and Treatment of Anorexia

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The treatment of anorexia nervosa is difficult and lengthy. The primary goals are restitution of normal nutrition and resolution of underlying psychological problems. Modes of therapy that can be used include behavior therapy, behavioral contracts, psychoanalysis, group therapy, insight-oriented therapy, and family therapy.

Anorexia nervosa has a variable prognosis. Anorexia nervosa has the highest mortality of all psychiatric conditions. This is due to medical complications, and the increased risk of suicide. Approximately 50% of those with anorexia nervosa make a full recovery. 33% improve and 20% have a chronic eating disorder.

In the United States alone, approximately 30 million people have diagnosable eating disorders, and 1.5% of American women have bulimia. 1 Bulimia nervosa is characterized by recurring episodes of binge eating, followed by vomiting, laxative or diuretic use, food intake restriction, or excessive exercise. 2
